# Travel Log: Costa Rica Trip

I went to Costa Rica on a guided birding tour in February, the start of the dry season. Once outside of San Jose (which has slower freeways than even Houston), a local driver is necessary unless you are good with poorly marked, 2-laned winding roads with no shoulders, exciting passing of slow vehicles with oncoming traffic, and people and animals walking on the pavement edges! But the routes are scenic, and many roadside vendors such as fruit stands abound.



While ascending from the central highlands, we made several stops at restaurants that also had hummingbird feeders, with astonishing numbers of hummingbirds that make our local ruby-throats dull by comparison.





We spent three full mornings at the La Selva Field Station in the lowlands. Decades of conservation research have resulted in maintained primary forest and secondary growth with superb views of birds and plants. Trees abound with ferns and bromeliads. Local guides lead small eco-oriented groups, so you avoid busloads of tourists and see nature closeup, such as tiny poison dart frogs.









And more garish birds in the surrounding areas (barbet and oropendola).





And spectacular owls (spectacled and crested).



We spent one afternoon on a boat trip along the Sarapiqui River, surrounded by dense forests with howler monkeys in the trees and unique birds like Green Ibis and Amazon Kingfishers along the banks.





Even the parking lot of the lodge in the lowlands had views of 3-toed sloths and howler monkeys with babies.





After the very warm and humid lowlands where we were thankful for air-conditioned rooms, we traveled back up into the mountains south of San Jose. A dramatic climate change, with much needed space heaters in the lodge rooms at 6000 feet altitude. Hummingbirds were all over the shrubbery and flowers, and bromeliads in the trees.

The main target species was the Resplendent Quetzal, whose habitat is the wild avocado trees bordering the local farmers' fields. A win-win situation has developed, with an association of famers messaging guides when birds are in their areas, guides taking their tourist groups to see the birds, and very happy birdwatchers paying big tips to the guides and the farmers.





The final visit was to a small (28 acre) family-owned highlands coffee farm, with coffee bushes interspersed with nitrogen fixing trees that allow a shade-grown bird-friendly organic environment that is light-years away from large commercial



monocultured enterprises.
